Coronavirus Information

A coronavirus is a type of virus. As a group, coronaviruses are common across the world. Typical symptoms of coronavirus include fever and a cough that may progress to a severe pneumonia causing shortness of breath and breathing difficulties.

The incubation period of the virus is between 2 and 14 days. This means that if a person remains well 14 days after contact with someone with confirmed Coronavirus, it is unlikely that they have been infected. The virus is spread through close contact with an infected person. Droplets produced when an infected person coughs or sneezes containing the virus are most likely to be the most important means of transmission.

The following symptoms may develop in the 14 days after exposure to someone who has the virus:

- Cough
- difficulty in breathing
- fever (a temperature of 38 degrees C or higher)

If you have any of these symptoms, you should:

- if it is an emergency, call 999 and tell them which country you have returned from in the last 14 days
- if you are unwell, but it is not an emergency, call NHS 111 and tell them which country
- you have returned from in the last 14 days or tell them your symptoms.

If you feel unwell:

- avoid contact with others
- stay at home, do not attend work or school
- do not travel while sick
- cover your mouth and nose with a tissue or your sleeve (not your hands) when coughing or sneezing. Throw tissues in the bin
- avoid touching your eyes, nose, and mouth with unwashed hands

Remember to wash hands often with soap and water for at least 20 seconds.

Use an alcohol-based hand sanitiser if soap and water are not available. This is particularly important after taking public transport.
